We are sad to report the passing of James Ramsden b.1923-2020, aged 96. He was a distinguished MP, Britain's last Secretary for War, and father to LSA Co-Founder Lottie Cheverton. He was a friend, a Patron and life-long supporter of LSA. His death came just four

months after that of his wife Juliet, who likewise took a life-long interest and gave loyal support to Leith School of Art. A fuller tribute to them and their part in the story of the School is planned for the next edition of Spectrum. ■

Nick moved with his family to Scotland in 2013, and more recently he has taught at LSA as Course Leader on

and as a lecturer at Edinburgh

Napier University and University

of Edinburgh Centre for Open Learning. He has also delivered regular Masterclass sessions for Edinburgh Printmakers where he served on the Board of Governors from 2016 -2020. More recently Nick has been appointed as External Examiner to University of Brighton BA (Hons) Printmaking course. Nick has contributed to national and international exhibitions and conferences and his work is represented in a number of collections including the Victoria and Albert Museum, London. He has curated a range of shows including Viewfinder which brought together artists whose work addresses our reading of the digital and photographic image. 'Although my practice is rooted

in tradition, I am constantly

surprised by the possibilities for innovation and experimentation that printmaking provides. For me, printmaking is the perfect medium for testing visual ideas, solving problems and creating new and exciting images.'

In his spare time Nick enjoys spending time with his family, developing a garden, growing vegetables and keeping chickens!



We are pleased to announce that Lucia was awarded both the prestigious RSA Patrons Award and the Walter Scott Award for her exceptional work.

'Becoming an artist in residence at Leith School of Art has allowed me to further my artistic practice, providing me with core materials to experiment with, in an inspiring environment full of other artists. The School has helped me to learn and to gain the knowledge needed to embark on life as a working artist.



After graduating I was awarded with the RSA 2020 New Contemporaries exhibition prize, for which I created all new paintings at Leith School of Art. Being able to create these paintings at LSA was an amazing opportunity. I was supported by technicians to build large scale boards in the School's workshop. My paintings were also critiqued and discussed by tutors, allowing me to gather a clearer vision in what I really wanted to communicate within my paintings.

My work was then exhibited and awarded with the RSA Patrons Award and The Walter Scotts Prize Award. I feel very privileged and grateful to have been able to create these works at Leith School of Art, as it has opened up new doors and provided me with a new confidence in pursuing my development within painting.′ ■



Catharine is a landscape painter whose practice focuses on working on location in the plein air tradition, directly from source within the landscape inspired by the expansive topography of the Pentland Hills, Blackford Hill, Calton Hill and Holyrood Park. This exhibition of new works maps the city's natural panoramas from the hills and parks of Edinburgh, through to a more intimate physical world of green spaces, public places, waterways, and suburban gardens in south Edinburgh surrounding her home in Oxgangs. The exhibition of new works charts a creative passion for working directly from source within the landscape. Each work represents a form of perceptual truth and reality, where the interplay between formal experimentation and content

Catharine grew up in Kilkeel, a market town in Northern Ireland, and has been living in Edinburgh since 2007. She studied at Manchester Polytechnic and then at Liverpool John Moores University before gaining a Masters degree in Illustration with Printmaking at Buckinghamshire Chilterns University College of Art & Design. She exhibits regularly at the RSA, the Edinburgh Academy, the Paisley Art Institute and Visual Arts Scotland. In 2014 she was announced the

winner of the Lynn Painter-Stainers Prize for creative representational. Prior to this in 2009 she won the Cuthbert Award at the Royal Glasgow Institute of Fine Arts, her painting recognised as the most distinguished by a New Young Artist. In 2013 she was shortlisted for the Jolomo Foundation Award for Scottish landscape Painting.


