Course Description:

A variety of drawing materials are used, both wet and dry, and students have the opportunity to work on longer sustained pieces, as well as fast paced, expressive drawing. Students will also learn about mixing paint and applying colour. A wide range of subject matter is studied: still life, landscape, and the figure. Each class is carefully structured with different subjects, media and processes taught so students are able to build on their learning from week to week. All materials are provided, in order that students make full use of their time in the studio. Most classes start with a short slide lecture of artists' work connecting art of the past and present to practical studio work.

The post holder will teach the Drawing & Painting evening course on Thursdays, teaching two hours per week from 7pm until 9pm. Tutors are expected to help set-up the studios and clear-up at the end of the day. Lectures, course preparation and occasional meetings are to be undertaken outside of teaching hours.
